Identify their own name. Describe what they see in a story book. Describe the setting and characters in a text. Suggest how a story might end. Draw a story. Say a sentence to a partner that includes key vocabulary. Link sounds to letters (phase 2) Orally blend the sounds in simple CV and CVC words Read the words by sight I, the and is. Listen to stories with increased attention and recall. Maintain attention, concentrate and sit quietly during appropriate activities. Listens and responds to others. Build up vocabulary that reflects the breadth of their experiences.
